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

MEMBER OF THE MONTH QUESTIONS

 What is your current professional role?
 I am an Assistant Professor of Maternal Fetal Medicine at Northwestern University in Chicago.

2. What drew you to the field of Perinatal Mental Health

Working in obstetrics, it became quite clear to me that to optimize maternal health, we needed to include mental health. While there are some inspiring exceptions, the paucity of focus on mental health within the field of obstetrics was a noticeable gap during my training that I aspired to help fill.

3. What is your current research involvement?

I am a physician-scientist who spends most of my time performing clinical research. My research focuses on health services and implementation science to bridge the chasm between clinical need and quality of care delivered.

4. What does a typical workday look like for you - including before and after work?

The best thing about my work is that nothing is typical. My clinical footprint spans the breadth of MFM, including L&D, ultrasound, and office coverage. My research is multi-disciplinary and so I am lucky to learn beside broad teams with exposure to new expertise every week.

5. What are you most excited about in your current work?

I am most excited about the potential. There is so much that we can and must do better. Being able to identify and evaluate sustainable solutions to perinatal mental health care delivery is motivating.

6. What's one of the most important things you've learned from a mentor or role model? Collaboration is essential to improving science.

7. What are your favorite things to do outside of work?

I have two sons, ages 2 and 4. Watching them experience the world, with unabashed enthusiasm, reminds me to see the joy around me and to advocate for the changes needed for their futures.

8. What is the most interesting book, podcast, TV series, or movie you've encountered in the past year?

I have just started listening to Dr. Kemi Doll's "Your unapologetic career". Kemi was my co-resident and she is an absolutely incredible human, physician, surgeon, academic, researcher. Her ability to cut through the academic nonsense to help you stay inspired to reach your goals is visionary. This is a must-listen for anyone, but particularly junior faculty.


ADVOCACY CORNER

Marilyn Ahun Trainee Spotlight

Marilyn N Ahun is a PhD candidate in Public Health at the University of Montreal in Canada. This month, she will be defending her thesis, which examines the mediators and moderators of the association between maternal depression and children's cognitive development. This work was funded by a Vanier Canada Graduate Scholarship from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council. Using data from two Canadian population-based cohorts, she examined how school experiences mediate the effect of maternal depression on children's academic performance and explored the role of geneenvironment mechanisms in the association between maternal depression and children's school readiness. Two of her thesis articles, including a meta-analysis of sex differences in the association between maternal depression and cognitive outcomes across childhood and adolescence, have recently been published in Psychological Medicine. Marilyn will pursue a Postdoctoral Fellowship this fall at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health and McGill University, where she will help to design, implement, and evaluate a mental health promotion intervention for mothers and fathers of young children in rural Pakistan.

I am thrilled to share that I have recently been awarded Postdoctoral Fellowship funding from the University of Calgary - Killam Fellowship, and from the Canadian Institutes of Health Research, to pursue a fellowship under the supervision of Dr. Dawn Kingston. My fellowship work aims - through parallel lines of both qualitative and quantitative inquiry into Canadian and international experiences - to elucidate strategies best suited to the Canadian context for the care of women experiencing acute postpartum mental illness. I am currently establishing an expert advisory group for the project, and would be happy to hear from anyone interested in getting involved!


